I am an experienced international creative producer and arts coordinator, specialising in Japanese music and performing arts. I have produced, promoted and managed highly acclaimed projects and events in more than 30 countries across the UK, Europe, Asia, the Middle East, and Oceania, creating one of the most successful platforms outside Japan. I am particularly keen on producing

cross-cultural and interdisciplinary projects based on Japanese culture.

One of the successful examples of such project is Noh Reimagined, a series of project and bi-annual festival exploring the 650 years old Noh theatre presented by the top-level Noh performers from Japan in collaboration with contemporary arts and performance.
