### **SPACE**

DaBY is located on the third floor of "KITANAKA BRICK&WHITE."

The facility mainly consists of an activity space for dance classes, creative projects (residencies), showings, workshops, and tryout performances. There is a small library in the corridor that functions as a space for dance archives, as well as backstage shower facilities, offices and storage spaces in the back. We are aiming to build a truly creative space for artists where we can meet diverse people and share knowledge.

The space is designed by ondesign partners who are based in the local Bashamichi area. They have experiences in urban design and networking with creators.

# DANCE BASE YOKOHAMA

#### **Dance Base Yokohama**

Dance Base Yokohama is a dancehouse that designs and organizes projects that specifically aim to improve the Japanese professional dance environment and support emerging creatives. In order to approach dance through an interdisciplinary lens, the space will facilitate exchanges not only between artists such as choreographers and dancers, but also between musicians, visual artists, video artists, lighting designers, producers, production teams, critics, researchers, and audience members. Having Eri Karatsu (Aichi Prefectural Art Theater Senior Producer) as our Artistic Director, we hope for Dance Base Yokohama to be a platform/magnetic field where people can casually get together, we are calling this place DaBY. While we offer residencies for artists to work on their creative projects, we aim to diversify our approach by hosting spaces for both local artists and residents through our workshops, experimental tryout performances, and dance archive projects.

Eri Karatsu (DaBY Artistic Director / Aichi Prefectural Art Theater Senior Producer) Karatsu studied Dance and Dance Education at Ochanomizu University and pursued her master's degree at the Graduate School of Humanities and Sciences there. After some experiences on stage herself, she started working as the first ever dance curator in Japan at the Aichi Arts Center from 1993. In 2000, she received the first Asahi Performing Arts Award at the Aichi Prefectural Arts Promotion Service. She started her current work in 2014. She was a curator (in the performing arts division) for the Aichi Triennale from 2010 to 2016. She has produced large scale international collaborations to experimental performances and has invited over 200 performances and projects to Japan. She has been a member of the Council for Cultural Policies at the Agency for Cultural Affairs, a coordinator of The Association of Public Theaters and Halls in Japan. a committee member of companies' arts and cultural foundations, a director of numerous committees, a judge for dance competitions, an executive committee member for the 65<sup>th</sup> Japanese Society for Dance Research Conference, and a part-time instructor at universities. As a lecturer, writer, and advisor, she works to improve the environment surrounding the field of performing arts and theaters in Japan. Her written work includes her book, L'intelligence du corps.

**Kenta Kojiri** (DaBY Dance Evangelist / Choreographer · Dancer)

Kojiri received the Apprentice Scholarship at the Prix de Lausanne in 1999. He joined the Nederlands Dans Theater I as the first Japanese male dancer to be part of the company. After he left, he was invited to perform with Royal Swedish Ballet, Noism, Sylvie Guillem's 6000 Miles Away, and Kylián Productions. He started developing more solo work as a choreographer with his solo performance Study for Self/portrait (premiered in 2017 at Hara Museum). He is an organizer of Opto along with Rei Watanabe and Ema Yuasa, a lecturer on expression-training for the Japanese national skating team, a curator of Dance Lab "Dancers, Dancing in Words," and an instructor/navigator for Saitama Dance Laboratory at the Saitama Arts Theater.

Ryu Suzuki (DaBY Associate Choreographer / Choreographer · Dancer)

Born in Yokohama, raised in Yamanashi, Wakayama, and Tokyo. He later studied at the Rambert School of Ballet and Contemporary Dance in the UK. He has performed in works by Akram Khan, Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, Philippe Decouflé, Inbal Pinto/Avshalom Pollak, Ella Rothschild, Motoko Hirayama, Ryohei Kondo, Kenta Kojiri, and Mari Natsuki. He has also received attention in and out of Japan for his choreographic works, as he was the first one to take home three awards at the Yokohama Dance Collection 2017 Competition I, including the "French Embassy Prize for Young Choreographer Award."
