	Helen Gardner; Rumi's poetry (in Persian) and the Bhagavad Gita (in Sanskrit)
	with Dr. Dudley Richards of Manchester College (Oxon.); etc.
1974	Moved to Japan to study Noh and martial arts in depth.
	Began study of Goju-ryu Karate at the dojo of Grandmaster Gogen Yamaguchi.
	Also began study of Aikido at the dojo of founder Morihei Ueshiba.
1975	Was introduced to a famous Noh teacher of the Kanze school, Makio (now
	Manzaburo III) Umewaka. Took part in many performances of Noh as a
	member of the Chorus or as a solo shimai dancer.
	Began a lifelong study and practice of Tibetan Buddhism and language. (Much to
	my surprise, was made a lama by the abbot of Thyangboche Monastery in the
	Solu-Khumbu region of Nepal in 1976!)
1977	Became an official apprentice of Master Umewaka. Began study of all aspects of
	Noh performance, including all the instruments. Continues to perform and to
	give lecture-demonstrations and workshops around the world on Noh.
	Also undertook an intensive study Sino-Japanese classics and classical poetry.
1981	Began study of Taiji (T'ai-chi) and Qigong (Ch'i-kung).
1986	Began in-depth study of the Chinese martial arts (Taiji, Xingyi, Bagua) taught by
	Grandmaster Wang Shujin and his successor, Wang Fulai, in Taiwan, as well as the
	old Yang-style taught by Grandmaster Yiu Kwong in Hong Kong. Now an
	international instructor of Qigong, Taiji, and Xingyi.
1999	Began formal study of ancient Egyptian language (Middle Egyptian) and
	hieroglyphics plus history and archaeology; slowly also added Late Egyptian and
2007	Coptic.
2007	Received ordination at Mount Koya in the esoteric Shingon sect of Japan; three
