Took a summer course at Banff Academy of Arts in Canada. Performed at numerous concerts in Los Angeles, Tokyo and Osaka. In 1997 she played Ravel's Piano Concerto in G major with National Oltenia Philharmonic Orchestra in Romania. Since 2012, she has been playing regularly with former second violin chief of Vienna Philharmonic, Peter Waechter. Also in 2013, she played Piano Trio with former chief cello player of Vienna Philharmonic.

She holds a lot of concert series. "Flute and Piano Concert" series that is organized by the composers and themes since 2000. "Singing Birds" series with Soprano, Flute and Piano, can be enjoyed by children and adults since 2012. "Tea Time Concert" series with Clarinet, Flute and Piano, organized by the composer's country since 2015. Each one is well received.
