

Grand Flower Master: Tohko Adachi the second

1979 Born in Kure City, Hiroshima Prefecture (birth name: Iku Adachi). Eldest daughter of the 17th head priest of the Jönenji temple (Honganji School, Jödö-Shinshö Sect).

1990 Became the adopted daughter of Tohko Adachi the first.

2002 Graduated from Tokyo University of Agriculture Started training and activities to be the next grand master and chairwoman while at university.

2005 Appointed as vice-grand master of the Kagei-Adachi School.

2006 Appointed as second grand master (succeeded to the name of Tohko) of the Kagei-Adachi School.

Appointed as second chairwoman of the Kagei-Adachi Society Incorporated Association (now a General Incorporated Association)

1936 Born in Tokyo

Father: Choka Adachi (Head of the Adachi-style Flower Arrangement School)

1973 Founded Kagei-Adachi School

1979 Granted permission to form the Kagei-Adachi Society Incorporated Association.

2003 Held planned exhibition, "Tsubaki Monogatari"

2006 Died at age 69
