### Artist Statement

"TA CHI TA SA\_" ("the urge to stand") is an ongoing series of performances that explore the urge of the human body to stand upright. In each documented performance, I trace the transition from lying on the ground to standing upright, focusing on every detail of every movement required. I am conscious about finding the equilibrium between the ground, weight, balance, gravity, and my body throughout the performance. The location of the performance is also an important element, as an exploration of how my body moving towards an upright position relates to the movement or positioning of environmental elements, whether it be a smokestack, the sunrise, or the surface of a lake. I also perform with musicians on occasion, in front of an audience.

I have also curated group shows, in 2011 and 2014, at Makii Masaru Fine Arts, Tokyo, titled "TA CHI TA SA\_ Collaboration Exhibition" in which other painters, video artists, performers, and photographers created their own work that explored and interpreted the idea of responding physically to the environment, verticality, or the notion of "standing upright." These experimental group shows demonstrate the diversity of how this seemingly simple subject matter can be interpreted.

My artistic practice began in painting, but my interest in the body has led me to create these performances. Experimenting with the relationship between painting and performance is something drive me to explore further in my practice.

Barnett Newman's paintings express verticality and space, with their straight, vertical lines that defy gravity yet hold spatial depth. This relates to the concept of the "TA CHI TA SA\_" series.

In 2016, I carried out the performance "Ta chi ta sa" Confronting Barnett Newman in Amsterdam in front of "Cathedra" (1951) at Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam, Netherlands. This evoked me a way to once again explore the core of the concept.

#### Ta chi ta sa

- ☐ To stand up listening to how the body wants to stand up.
- ☐ To feel the inner strength and desire to stand vertically against gravity and the body which follows it .
- ☐ To experience the horizontal plane with the weight of the body and the impulse of the vertical direction at the same time.
- ☐ To feel the space around the body which would be changed while standing upright .

# "Ta chi ta sa \_" Confronting Barnett Newman Tours; Performance, Documents and Exhibition

Takako Ihoda "Ta chi ta sa \_" 2023

September 2023

In 1995, I started an series of act in nature and in various environments with taking records of them and named these activities "Ta chi ta sa", and along with these I have collaborated with artists, musicians, photographers, metteurs-en-scène, and dancers to produce and represent the works. Takako Ihoda, who has been executing these performances, is trying to confront the paintings of Barnett Newman, who influenced me the most as an artist and gave me the starting point of this activity, with the act of standing slowly. I will visit Newman's works all over the world, stand in front of them, and record the performance with video images and photographs. Besides the performance, the tour holds my one-man show that displays the records so far as an integral work.

After tens of minutes taken to stand up finally, how does the vertical line standing through the body resonate with space and time created by each Newman's painting and its vertical line? Can you feel what Newman called "Sublime" in this act of "stand" and "standing" that most people do everyday?

About "Ta chi ta sa," late Kunio Motoe (former professor of the Tama Art University) described the performance as a process becoming a vertical line called a zip that appears in Newman's paintings, saying that while the "space is essentially public," the "time is utterly private" for Newman, who emphasized the "work of the physical sensation," and asked if Ms. Ihoda's indigenous and physical gestures are wonderful realizations of that. "

What physical changes occurs depending on his work I face, country, and location? How do they accept Newman's work in each country? How do you feel and understand the act of "Ta chi ta sa"? What do you see in that?

Since Newman's works are few, I am organizing this tour to make Newman and his works appreciated by the larger public. I am planning this tour with the intention of myself confronting Newman first, and then taking them around to various countries!
